Eye Bank Hosts Career Day for Visiting Miami Students

Some kids might be disappointed to spend their summer field trip visiting the Florida Lions Eye Bank rather than Zoo Miami. But not 11-year-old McCarthney Cerisier. "The zoo is so common," He said after inspecting a sclera, the white of a human eye, in the eye bank. "This is not so common. You get to see a human eye and how it works."

Most of the other 28 Breakthrough Miami students agreed. They spent a day touring Bascom Palmer Eye Institute and learned about careers open to students who take their schooling seriously, and set their sights high.

Breakthrough Miami is designed to inspire and prepare motivated low-income students to stay on a path to college and offers fun but rigorous educational and mentoring opportunities. Their Career Day field trip to Bascom Palmer was part of a six-week summer institute hosted by some of Miami's private college preparatory schools.

Jorge A. Peña, M.D., technical director of the eye bank, described the bank's "safe" as a "huge refrigerator" used to keep human eye tissue chilled, and ready for transplant in all types of sight-saving eye surgeries. Then, in one of the day's highlights, he led the students to the small eye bank lab on the third floor, and passed around human eyes that have been donated for research.

A collaborative effort between the Dania Lions Club and President Jim Silvernale and Memorial Regional Hospital in Hollywood will result in a donation of used eye glasses to the Florida Lions Eye Bank.

Ingrid Reyes, a Central Supply Supervisor at Memorial Regional Hospital and the President of the Employee Activities Committee (EAC), is enthusiastic about leading the new project at the hospital. "We will begin here and hopefully, extend the drive to other sites in the Memorial Healthcare System."

Lions Club International and the World Health Organization estimate there are 153 million people worldwide with uncorrected refractive errors including near-sightedness, far-sightedness and astigmatism – problems that can be quickly diagnosed and easily treated. Unfortunately, many people cannot afford eyeglasses. Many do not know they can receive glasses through the Lions organization. Eyeglass collection drives, like at Memorial Regional, help supply those eye glasses to

select Lions Clubs.

"The need is great and we want to help," Ingrid added. Thanks to the efforts of the EAC at Memorial, its employees and visitors and the Lions, many more people will have the gift of sight restored.
