

Florida Lions Eye Bank Expands Into Social Media

In a 2012 study performed by the Georgetown University Center for Social Impact Communication and Waggener Edstrom, it was discovered that social media is one of the primary ways people are learning about new causes to support.

According to the study, "65% of people who support nonprofits online (by donating online, signing online petitions, etc.) indicated that the first way they heard about the causes that they



chose to support was through a family member or friend on social media."

Eye Bank Executive Director Visits Capitol Hill

The Florida Lions Eye Bank Executive Director Elizabeth Fout-Caraza joined Eye Bank Directors from throughout the country on a recent visit to Washington, D.C. to both learn and educate.

Government representatives and industry experts, invited by the Eye Bank Association of America (EBAA), educated the Directors about legislative issues affecting eye donation and the distribution of ocular tissue in the United States and abroad. Eye Bank Directors then took to Capitol Hill to educate government representatives about eye donation and about the mission of Eye Banks worldwide.

"Educating our elected officials about eye banking and eye donation is critically important in this healthcare environment. We need the members of Congress to understand the work that we are doing in our communities," said Elizabeth, who met with representatives from Senator Marco Rubio's office and from



Congresswoman Frederica Wilson's office.

Both meetings proved to be fruitful as the representatives learned about the Florida Lions Eye Bank and the impact that it has had on the community of South Florida in its more than 50-year history.

"It will act as a reminder to them," said Ingrid, "If not today, then tomorrow they can drop in the eyeglasses they no longer use." 
